#### REGISTERED FARMERS AND EXPORTERS

- Exporters with access to packing houses certified by the Plant Quarantine Produce Inspection Branch should, along with their application, submit the name, telephone number, farm location and RADA identification number of potential farmers to participate in this programme.
- Farmers in the following approved districts from which fruit fly monitoring data is currently collected are welcome to participate: Albion, Woodburn, Heartease, Norris, Leith Hall, Roselle in St. Thomas and Bull Bay, St. Andrew.

#### PROSPECTIVE FARMERS AND EXPORTERS

- Prospective exporters must register with the PQ/PI and obtain a certified packing facility.
- Farmers not currently in an approved district must contact the PQ/PI Branch to obtain the programme requirements.

## MAIN REQUIREMENTS OF EXPORTERS AND FARMERS PARTICIPATING IN THIS PROGRAMME

- 1. Exporters and farmers are mandated to attend the annual orchard management training sessions conducted by PQ/PI to be held in January 2022
- 2. Farmers are responsible for:
  - Pruning mango trees to maintain an open canopy of manageable size.
  - Field sanitation: Removal and disposal of fallen fruits from the farm daily.
  - Implementation of a chemical control programme for adequate pest control.
