



Frosty Pod Rot Hotline Protocol

In an effort to quickly ascertain the spread of the Frosty Pot Rot disease in cocoa across Jamaica, a hotline system was established in 2016. The hotline system came in effect immediately upon confirmation of the disease and following the Minister's press briefing to the country on September 29, 2016.

The disease has been confirmed in four parishes- Clarendon, St. Mary, St. Catherine, and St. Andrew and continues to spread rapidly. As a result, the National Plant Protection Organization, the Plant Quarantine/Produce Inspection Branch, reinstituted the revised Plants (Quarantine) Frosty Pod Rot Order, 2017, which was gazetted on December 13, 2017.

The revised Order dictates that the inter-parish movement of cocoa pods, plants, seedlings, cuttings, plant products, plant related material or plant related articles is not permitted nor the sale of cocoa pods outside of the parish of harvest, unless written permission is given by the Chief Plant Quarantine/Produce Inspector (Sections 4-5). These measures are in an effort to prevent the movement of the disease into currently uninfected areas.
