



#### AGRO-INVEST CORPORATION'S AGRI-FINANCING

The Agro-Investment Corporation (Agro-Invest), a key driver in managing Jamaica's Agro Parks and Production Zones, will be expanding into microfinance, launching services tailored specifically to the needs of Jamaica's agricultural sector.

This strategic initiative aims to bolster economic growth by providing accessible financing options to small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) within the farming community.



A **Matching Grant Scheme** will also be implemented in partnership with the UKCIF and CDB for the Southern Plains Agricultural Development Project (SPADP) area.

#### PROJECT F.E.E.D

### FEEDING THE ECONOMY THROUGH EMPOWERMENT AND DEVELOPMENT (YOUTH & WOMEN INITIATIVE)

A comprehensive Agricultural Development Programme for youth, women and persons with disabilities. 25%

of all new agro park lands to be assigned to women, youth and persons with disabilities.

### \$390 MILLION RESERVED FOR YOUTH FARMERS

Under the Production Incentive Programme, youth farmers will be provided with direct support for specific crop lines.

## YOUTH IN AGRICULTURE GREENHOUSE CERTIFICATION PROGRAMME

This initiative will allow youths trained and certified in greenhouse operation and management by HEART NSTA/Trust & the Jamaica 4-H to benefit from an infrastructure grant to establish their own commercial enterprise.



### \$100 MILLION TERTIARY SCHOLARSHIP

This will be a public private partnership managed by the Jamaica 4-H. The scholarship will be for careers in Genetics, Agricultural Engineering, Precision Agriculture and Soil Science.

## FREE TRACTOR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TRAINING

This will be in partnership with HEART/NSTA Trust, NCTVET and the Jamaica 4-H Clubs.

### SMALL RUMINANT DISTRIBUTION PROGRAMME

The Ministry, through Jamaica 4-H, will train and certify youth and women in livestock production. Graduates will be granted animals as input to start their own commercial operation.

# DAIRY COTTAGE INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT (WOMEN AND YOUTH)

The Jamaica Dairy Development Board through strategic partnerships with the Jamaica Network of Rural Women Producers (JNRWP), will be expanding its effort in developing cottage industries in goat milk and its byproducts including cheese, yoghurt, soap, jam, jellies, pickles and syrups.


Goat milk producers will be provided with supplements such as milk boosters, milk replacer and mineral blocks, pasture development and fencing.


#### JAMAICA 4-H LEADS FOR THE REGIONAL 'YOUTH IN AGRICULTURE STRATEGY'

The Jamaica 4-H Clubs will implement a 4-H International Exchange Programme, under the CARICOM Regional Youth in Agriculture Strategy, to facilitate cultural and agricultural exchanges for youth farmers across the region.

**4-H Mentorship Programme** to provide guidance and support to clubites and youth farmers.

### STATE OF THE ART PIGGERY FACILITY AT BODLES

Construction of a **\$443 Million** Piggery Unit at the Bodles Research Station in Old Harbour, St. Catherine under the Rehabilitation of Research Centres Project Phase 2.

This initiative will facilitate the provision of high-quality genetic stocks for expansion and further development of the pig industry.



### THE JAMAICA HOPE REHABILITATION PROJECT

The project's overarching goal is to restore Jamaica Hope Breed's functional capacity by implementing a genetic evaluation system that will increase the frequency of desirable genes in animals, and improve milk yield, fertility, and environmental adaptability.



A cutting-edge seed processing facility aimed at optimizing the swift extraction, treatment, and drying of seeds.

# A SEED AND NURSERY CERTIFICATION (SNC) UNIT


The SNC unit will stand as the driver for regulating the seed and nursery sector, thus ensuring that Jamaican farmers obtain clean (pest free), quality and true to type seeds for production and productivity.



## SOIL REGENERATION FERTILITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The Ministry has partnered with Jamaica Organic Agriculture Movement (JOAM) for the implementation of the Jamaica Soil Regeneration Fertility Improvement project.

This project targets enhancing soil health and fertility levels by utilizing methods such as compost, biochar, and effective microorganisms.




### SOIL HEALTH AND FERTILITY TRAINING

- 300 individuals will receive training on soil and water management techniques.
- The ministry's laboratory services will be enhanced through equipment acquisition, leading to a notable enhancement in soil diagnostics and testing capabilities.









The PQPI Branch in partnership with the Jamaica Constabulary Force to ensure the detection and prevention of exotic pests and diseases at our ports.



This programme is design to initiate and incentivize the production of vegetable crops and small stock in urban centres across Jamaica (to supplement household food security and income preservation needs).

#### It will involve the:

- distribution of the backyard kits,
- encouragement of hydroponic farming and
- participation of ministries, NGO, churches and other groups.

## NATIONAL FOOD RESERVE (NFR)

To design and implement a national food reserve strategy under which an emergency food reserve framework is to be establish to ensure that Jamaica is food secured.



### NETWORK OF MOBILE COLD STORAGE UNITS

This initiative seeks to provide **cold storage solutions** to farmers and other key stakeholders for perishable agricultural crops at strategic locations at a **reasonable cost** within key production areas.

The aim is to minimize food loss and manage glut situations.



#### **IRRIGATION** KITS PROJECT In an effort to mitigate the impact of climate change, the Ministry will distribute an additional 2,500 irrigation kits to farmers across the island.



# RESTORATION AND ESTABLISHMENT PROGRAMME (CREP)

The CREP is a revitalization and expansion plan for select regulated commodities (coffee, cocoa and the spices) over a 4-year period.

The core components of the CREP will focus on training, "clean" planting material, quality assessment and certification, value-addition and use of new technologies (such as germplasm base, clonal propagation and rainwater harvesting system). This will support over 15,000 farmers and their families.

The CREP plan will be implemented through Public-Private Partnership valued at J\$3.58 billion.

# THE DAIRY LIVESTOCK INNOVATION AND NUTRITION KNOWLEDGE PROGRAMME (D-LINK)

- Introduce solar powered cooling systems
- Purchase and distribute 15 new mobile milkers across our dairy farming clusters and schools
- Install 7 energy milk cooling tanks
- Establish a technology center and equipment lease programme
- Facilitate the importation of live cattle embryos and semen of adaptable international breeds



It aims to create sustainable dairy operations powered by solar energy, which will reduce the dependence of local dairy farmers on non-renewable forms of energy, and reduce overhead utility costs.

The Board will ensure a cohesive and comprehensive national framework for livestock development.

The Ministry will establish a Steering Committee to transition the Dairy Development Board into the National Livestock Development Board.

### FISHERIES INITIATIVES

YEAR 2024/25



Aimed at improving/upgrading the infrastructure of three (3) fishing beaches in:

- 1.St. Mary
- 2. Clarendon
- 3.St. Elizabeth

### BLUE ECONOMY INCENTIVE PROGRAMME

This initiative seeks to provide incentives in the form of inputs, which includes safety equipment for offshore fishing as well as communication and navigation equipment (safety jackets, marine VHF radios and GPS devices).

Key beneficiaries include off-shore fishers exploring opportunities in the Blue Economy especially those in Pedro and Morant Bay.



Twenty (20) boats and engines for youths to kickstart fishing ventures.





### BOAT RETOOLING PROGRAMME

To provide communication devices and assist fisherfolks with replacement of boat parts such as engines.

## ORNAMENTAL FISH FARMING REVITALISATION PROJECT

This project is valued at US\$105,000 and is aimed at revitalizing ornamental fish production for local and export markets.

It will facilitate the development of a clearing house for the export of ornamental fish, providing ornamental fish farmers with broodstock and facilitate improved organization of the ornamental industry.

## ALTERNATIVE CLIMATE RESILIENT FISHERIES PRODUCTION

This initiative is geared towards piloting 8 demonstration projects, collectively valued at over US\$400,000.

These demonstration projects will focus on exploring alternative profitable and sustainable fisheries industries outside of finfishing. These include pelagic fishing; ecotourism in fish sanctuaries; oyster production; sea moss production, local fish feed production, revitalising freshwater fishing and a Bio-secure, climate resilient Recirculating Aquaculture System (RAS) Hatchery.

### BAUXITE LAND LEASE PROGRAMME

The programme will create an efficient and affordable channel for farmers in bauxite areas to access lands for agricultural purposes at below-market-rate lease values.

The lands to be used in this initiative fall under the Midlands properties managed by the JBI on behalf of the NLA.

### PORT DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION PROJECT (PDEP)

The Ministry has been collaborating with the Port Authority of Jamaica, the Ministry of Finance and the Public Service, the Bauxite and Alumina companies and Caribbean Cement Company to gain access to bulk port facilities to allow for the exportation of increased quantities of industrial minerals.

The PDEP, will include an upgrade and expansion to the Reynolds Pier in St. Ann. It will be using blue and green next-generation technologies and solutions to expand the loading capacity to 8 million metric tons a year. This new expanded Pier will be a multi-faceted Port, that can dually berth Panamax vessels that exports Industrial material and berths the new large Cruise vessels.




## THE MINERALS RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT INSTITUTE

This is a merger of the Geological Survey functions of the Mines and Geology Division, the Jamaica Bauxite Institute, and the Earthquake Unit. This new entity will focus on managing the country's mineral resources, developing new mineral products, and executing seismic research.

The MRDI will also play a significant role in assisting the country to treat with some of the impacts of ongoing climate change and ensuring that we pay greater attention to preparing for and minimizing the impacts of earthquakes. The entity will have no regulatory functions.
